RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Bay of Islands Show will be conducted under the amended Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (RAS). A copy of these may be seen at the Secretary's Office on the Showgrounds during the duration of the Show. All persons admitted to the Showgrounds shall be subjected to these Rules and Regulations.

The Bay of Islands P & I Association is an affiliated A & P Show of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) and as such the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) for Forbidden Substances will apply at the Show.

The use of tranquilisers, stimulants or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals **is at the owners risk** and will be carried out under FSJC procedures.

(Ref 10 of RAS By laws and Regulations Section 55A).

Maximum Monetary Penalty under RAS Rules is \$1,500.

Maximum Monetary Penalty under NZER Rules is \$15,000.

HEALTH & SAFETY

1. The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit; notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any Officer or Servant of the Association; and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such exhibitors. By signing the entry form declaration, exhibitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.
2. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals on the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.
3. The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable.
4. It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property and to make provision for the protection of the property of others. The Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
5. Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.
6. Parking is entirely at the owners' risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or stewards.

GENERAL SHOW POLICY RULE

The purpose of the Bay of Islands P & I Show is to provide the community and visiting competitors, the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition.

The Bay of Islands P & I Association has therefore made a policy rule *that any person or persons who verbally, or otherwise, abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials will be asked to leave the Showgrounds and their offending actions WILL be referred to other Districts A & P Shows.*

CANCELLATION OF SHOW

In the event of the cancellation of the Show refunds will be made as follows:

80% of Competitors Entry Fees.

80% of Trade Exhibitors Site Fees.

DAIRY & BEEF SECTIONS

RULES REGARDING TB REGULATIONS

1. **For animals from herds** which are under movement restrictions imposed by an Official Directive or Restricted Place Notice issued by the Animal Health Board (AHB).

The owner will have to satisfy the requirements of the Movement Control before animals can move off the property to the Show. Provided these requirements are met, the AHB cannot prevent these animals from being shown. However, A&P Associations may choose not to accept such animals in the interests of other exhibitors. The RAS and AHB recommend A&P Associations do not accept such animals.

2. **For animals from Declared Movement Control Areas:**

All show animals over the age of 90 days are to be tested, and have a clear test, within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show.

For animals from C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas (e.g. Northland):

No test required but a clearly dated test allocation form or other documentation from the AHB must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test.

For animals from all other herds and areas:

If the herd has a C3 status or better, no test is required PROVIDED the last whole herd test was within 12 months prior to the Show.

If the last whole herd test was not within 12 months of the Show, then Show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within the current Show season.

If the herd has a status of C1 or C2, then Show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within the current Show season.

Competition for Dairy and Beef Sections.

This competition includes all Northern District A & P Shows which encompasses Kaitia & Districts to Franklin. This includes the Royal Easter Show. Open to all young handlers within New Zealand.

The competitor will be 18 years and under as at the 1st October of the current show season.

The competitor may use an animal of any age and the animal does not have to be the property of the handler.

Each competitor may only enter either the beef or dairy class, not both. To be eligible for the Northern District prize the competitor must have competed at three or more Northern District Shows in these classes this show season.

The winners of the overall competition, one dairy & one beef handler will receive \$250 sponsored by the NDCRAS and a medal awarded by the RAS of NZ. In the case of a draw the prize money will be split accordingly.

If entries are low competitors may be paraded together, however each class will be judged separately.

Judging will consider the following areas:

Turnout - Appearance of Handler. The dress, footwear and general tidiness needs to be considered i.e. clean, strong shoes or boots. No jandals or gumboots. If a hat is worn it must be worn correctly.

No logos or advertising to be present on any clothing including hats. For the Royal Easter Show the older group should be wearing a breed uniform or white coat.

Presentation of Animal. The animal itself is not to be judged however the general presentation is to be taken into consideration as the youth will have prepared the animal for the ring.

The halter should be clean and fit the animal correctly. Rope or leather halters allowed.

For beef competitors if a show stick is used it must be carried correctly.

Ability of Handling Animal.

To parade and "show off animal"

To stop when asked.

Able to "stand" animal up.

To move on again as requested.

Be aware of different leading styles i.e. Dairy may lead from the front and beef lead at the shoulder.

Knowledge of Animal. Breeding - Breed and able to name sire & dam. Age - Date of birth of animal
